

Objective – These camps allow the participants to experience many hunting, conservation, and recreational opportunities that are available in the great outdoors of Iowa and become aware of the state’s great diversity. Activities are led by experts in their field, which allows participants to leave with a new found confidence in new and old activities.

Participants – Camps are for young adults ages 12 to 15 who enjoy the outdoors and would like to learn more and improve their skills.

Location – Camp Lookout, Montrose, Iowa Camp Lookout is located on the bluff of the Mississippi River above Montrose which offers a breath taking view. The diverse habitats of the area are ideal for this purpose. We will also use the Heron Bend Wildlife Area.

Lodging will be in bunk house style cabins with 12 young adults and 2 adults per cabin. You will need to bring your own linens (pillow, blanket, sheets, towels, sleeping bag, etc). Shower facilities are at the site. All buildings are smoke free. The food is included and will be prepared on site by our concessionaire. You will not be hungry!

Chaperones - Chaperones get a 3 day free vacation while enjoying the great outdoors with young adults. Chaperones truly make the camp flow smoothly and make a difference on what the young adults learn from this camp. The camp would not be a success without the help and support of chaperones. As a chaperone your responsibility is being a part of a group during the day and making sure the group gets to each activity. At night you are responsible for 12 young adults. But the most important responsibility is to make sure everyone is having fun, including yourself! We ask that chaperones be at least 16 years old and a background check is required prior to camp for all chaperones.

How to Register – Mail the completed registration form at the bottom of the page, *along with a \$20 check for camp fees* to LCCB, PO Box 218, Montrose, IA 52639, (319-463-7673). **Please make checks payable to Three Rivers Conservation Foundation.** The additional cost of \$130 per camper will be sponsored by the Three Rivers Conservation Foundation, Lee County Pheasants Forever Chapter, Quail Forever, and grants.

Registration is on a first form received, first registered, & space is limited to 25 participants in each camp. The deadline to register is July 22, 2011. IF YOU ATTENDED CAMP LAST YEAR YOU ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO ATTEND THIS YEAR.
